Maybe you have seen this name, "Saffa," around Drumright in years past. I know that I have. But I didn't know anything about the family that carried this name, or their son that proudly served as one of the very first Oklahoma Highway Patrol troopers. Down at the depot, we have some photos that mark highlights in his life.

Paul George Saffa was born in Lebanon and came to the United States as a young man, following in the footsteps of other family members and friends who had left the old country, for a new start. He first settled in Krebs, Oklahoma, where he met and married Ester Ollie Mickle. They would eventually have seven children, one of whom was William Paul Saffa.

The Saffa family moved to Drumright and opened a grocery store at 301 East Broadway. Their children attended Drumright Public Schools. William or "Wild Bill," as he was called by his buddies, began to distinguish himself in high school sports. He was said to be an extraordinarily strong and consistent athlete, always playing hard and pushing for the win. Bill lettered in football, basketball, wrestling and track. Bill graduated from Drumright High School in 1928.

Bill Saffa wound up at
Notre Dame, playing
football for the Fighting
Irish. His coach was Elmer
Layden. Notre Dame was a
collegiate powerhouse and
had winning seasons during
the years Bill played. Bill
majored in Physical

Education and graduated from Notre Dame in 1937.

The Oklahoma Highway Patrol was created under Governor E. W. Marland in 1937. My assumption is that Bill was highly recruited to come back to Oklahoma and apply for admission to the very first Oklahoma Highway Patrol Training Academy. The athletic training was very strenuous, but Bill had always been a strong athlete and carried himself well. This military style academy was different, in that it instilled professional attitudes and qualities into the trainees. The very first academy graduated 125 troopers, one of whom was Bill.


It wasn't easy being a new state trooper in a state that had never had any real law enforcement out on the roadways. The national highway system hadn't been developed yet. Speed limits and traffic regulations were still in development in many areas of the state. These first troopers had to use their training along with a good dose of common sense. In the first nine months of Oklahoma having troopers on duty, they issued 288,277 warnings, compared to only 5,518 citations and arrests.

Bill and his first wife, Cassie Mae Moses, had six children, William, Susan Johnny, Connie, Karen, and Sonya. His second marriage was to Margaret Kathryn Hayes in 1983. Bill proudly served as an Oklahoma Highway Patrol
Trooper and had an illustrious
career. He passed away at the
age of ninety-four on September
23, 2003. He is buried in Cushing
at Fairlawn Cemetery. The
epitaph on his headstone reads,
"Our Father – Our Hero. A Man of
Men."

And yes, here is one more story about an extraordinary individual that happened to be from Drumright, Oklahoma. We thank him for his service to the state of Oklahoma as a member of the very first class of Oklahoma Highway Patrol officers.







Prior to being one of the first state troopers, he played football at Drumright High School; he then went on to play for Notre Dame for four years.



Funeral services for Drumright resident, Dale Hester, were held 11:00 a.m. Friday, August 8th in the Oak Grove Baptist Church with officiating. Interment followed in the Drumright Oak Hill Cemetery. Funeral services are entrusted to the care of Michael' Funeral Home of Drumright.

Dale was born in Yale, Oklahoma on January 10, 1948 to the late Clovis Dale & Helen Elnora (Ishmael) Hester.
