Summer has arrived in Drumright, Oklahoma! So that means there must be a celebration of some kind being planned. I was down at the depot the other day, and I began to wonder about the big Drumright celebrations of past years. Here's a look at what I found.

In the freight room of the Drumright Historical Museum, I found a stack of well-preserved newspapers from 1962. That happened to be the 50th year of Drumright's existence. The headline boasted of a huge four-day celebration marking fifty years of community progress. Every business posted an advertisement praising their customers and highlighting their connection to the community. The paper also

included interviews with well-known citizens and politicians. This special edition had poems, photos and all kinds of special articles commemorating this momentous occasion.

Much praise was given to the 1962 Drumright Chamber of Commerce, for their production of this four-day celebration. A grand list of activities was planned for this community, and it all happened July 19-22, 1962. Prior to the event, banners were hung everywhere, and merchants fixed up their store fronts and sidewalks. A reporter commented that the chamber was "in a tizzy" and focused on "housecleaning before company arrives." Check out this list of events to celebrate the Golden Anniversary of Drumright.

- 1. A huge parade was held boasting a million dollars' worth of oilfield equipment, plus marching bands, and floats.
 Yvonne Choteau, a prima ballerina from Oklahoma, was a special guest and rode on a float.
- 2. An antique display was set up in the old Kraker building on the south side of East Broadway. It was arranged and hosted by Tommy Joe Caldwell.
- 3. A huge fireworks display was held in the park. There was no display for the Fourth of July, so that this display could be gigantic.
- 4. An exhibition baseball game was held between Drumright and Yale. By the way, I didn't find a score, so we will hope that Drumright won.
- 5. Huff's Rexall Drugs hosted a Model Car Building Contest. Kids built model cars, and they were all displayed inside the drug store. Then judges picked winners from various categories and gave ribbons.
- 6. With it being the middle of July, it was hot! The city offered free swimming at the city pool.
- 7. A huge rodeo was held at the local arena and lots of local and well-known cowboys participated for cash and prizes, supported by local businesses.
- 8. Out at the Fair Barn, a free barbecue dinner was hosted by the chamber and everyone in the community was welcome.
- 9. Lastly, a fun square dance was held after the barbecue, and fun was had by all.

What a wonderful time it must have been living in Drumright in 1962. But what an exciting time it is to be here in Drumright now! We have a phenomenal Chamber of Commerce that is totally committed to making Drumright a good place to live and work and raise a family. There are community events happening all the time, just look around. We have the Monthly Market at the museum on the first Saturday of each month. There are youth activities in Whitlock Park on Friday evenings. Our 53 rd Oil Patch Celebration is coming up on October 4th! We should continually celebrate our community. After-all, it's a mighty poor frog that won't praise its own pond!

Ribbon Cutting - A Day to Remember at Tidewater Winery!




















Derrek Wayne Beaumont




